GUIDE TO COMPETITORS and CONDITIONS OF PLAY

INTRODUCTION

1. This document will consist of 2 (two) parts, namely;
 - A Guide to Competitors and
 - Conditions of Play
2. The 2 (two) parts of this document must be read in conjunction with each other to avoid any confusion.

GUIDE TO COMPETITORS

3. Host District and Duration of the Tournament

- 3.1 The Tournament will be hosted by the Johannesburg Bowls Association over the period 5 July 2018 to 28 July 2019. The Tournament schedule will be as follows;

3.1.1 Weekend 1

Friday, 5 July 2019	Mixed Pairs, (Sectional Play)
Sat/Sun 6/7 July 2019	Men's Pairs and Ladies Singles (Sectional and Knockout play)

3.1.2 Weekend 2

Friday, 12 July 2019	Mixed Pairs, (Knockout Play)
Sat/Sun 13/14 July 2019	Men's Singles and Ladies Pairs (Sectional and Knockout play)

3.1.3 Weekend 3

Sat/Sun 20/21 July 2019	Men's and Ladies Fours (Sectional and Knockout play)
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3.1.4 Week 4

Mon 22 – Fri 26 July 2019 Knockout stages all disciplines.

3.1.5 Weekend 4

Sat/Sun 27/28 July 2019	Semi-finals and Finals all disciplines, Prize-giving and Closing Ceremony.
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- 3.2 Depending on the number of entries and /or the weather conditions, the Committee reserves the right to reschedule matches on non-playing days to complete sectional play, section playoffs or playoffs, to ensure that the Tournament is completed in the time allocated.

4. Jury of Appeal

- 4.1** The Committee will appoint a Jury of Appeal, which must be approved by Gauteng Bowls, and will consist of:
 - 4.1.1** A member of the Executive of Gauteng Bowls or a Nominee.
 - 4.1.2** A member of the Host District's Executive Committee, who is not a Member of the Committee.
 - 4.1.3** The Chairperson of the Host District's Technical Officials Standing Committee or a nominee of that Committee.
- 4.2** All decisions of the Jury of Appeal shall be final.

5. Eligibility of Players

- 5.1** A player participating in the Fours, Pairs and Singles events may only do so through one district and one club. i.e. The player's club of first choice or the player's dual membership club. Should the player choose the latter, he/she must supply documentary proof with the official entry form that their club of first choice is in agreement with such an entry.
- 5.2** The Bowls SA membership card, that must be available at all times, determines the club at which the member is registered as first choice.
- 5.3** A player may represent more than one club in the Mixed Pairs event where a player is a dual member. i.e. That player, although representing their club of first choice in the Singles, Pairs and Fours disciplines, but is not representing their club of first choice in the Mixed Pairs must supply documentary proof with the official entry form that their club of first choice is in agreement with such an entry.

6. Refunds

- 6.1** No refunds will be made to players or teams withdrawing from the Tournament once the draw has been published.

7. Dress and Footwear

- 7.1** All players must be dressed in accordance with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls.
- 7.2** Club approved coloured clothing may be worn subject to all members of a team being dressed uniformly.
- 7.3** All players shall wear heelless footwear that has either a smooth or ribbed sole (maximum depth of 2mm of the ribbed section of the sole making contact with the green – the thickness of a matchstick)
- 7.4** Crocs or similar footwear are prohibited.
- 7.5** Men may wear tailored shorts.
- 7.6** No rugby or cargo pants may be worn

8. Advertising

Advertising on clothing in conflict with the Sponsor's business will not be allowed without the specific permission of the Tournament Committee, whose decision will be final.

9. Reporting for Play

- 9.1** Skips of the Pairs, Mixed Pairs, Fours and the participants in the Singles events shall report to the Tournament Official immediately on arrival no later than 08h30.
- 9.2** Declaration Forms must be completed in full and returned to the Tournament Official prior to the commencement of the first day's play.
- 9.2.1** First names (no nicknames), surnames and BSA membership numbers as well as contact numbers of all players must be entered.
- 9.2.2** A reserve for the Fours may be declared as per 10.2.1
- 9.2.3** A contact number for the team or the participant in the Singles event must be filled in.
- 9.2.4** All participants', including the declared reserve in the Fours, BSA membership cards must be available.
- 9.2.5** No reserve is permitted in the Pairs, Mixed Pairs or Singles events.
- 9.3** Participants are not required to pay a facility fee as this is included in the original entry fees.

10. Catering

- 10.1** For the duration of the Tournament the charges for refreshments shall be set for all clubs by the Tournament Committee before the start of the tournament – the charges may not be possible at some clubs.
- 10.2** Meal tickets must be purchased before the commencement of play.
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| Early morning tea/coffee/rusks/biscuits | R10.00 |
| Mid-morning tea/coffee with sandwiches | R25.00 |
| Lunch (tea/coffee no extra charge) Hot meals | R50.00 |
| Light meals | R30.00 |
- 10.3** Players with special dietary requirements must make arrangements with the hosting club before the commencement of play.

11. Format of Play

- 11.1** The Pairs and Fours will be played on a league system in sections of 6 (six) teams over 15 ends. Further playoff games up to and including the last 8 will also be played over 15 ends and thereafter over 21 ends.
- 11.2** The Mixed Pairs will be played on a league system in sections of 4 (four) teams over 15 ends. Further playoff games up to and including the last 8 will also be played over 15 ends and thereafter over 21 ends.
- 11.3** The Singles will be played on a league system in sections of 3 (three) players. The first player to reach 21 shots will be declared the winner. Further playoffs will be decided on a knockout basis also determined by the first player to reach 21 shots. Players will be required to mark one game. The winner of the first game will mark the second.

12. Decals

- 12.1** Clubs decals will be permitted provided each member of the team have the same decals affixed to their bowls.
- 12.2** The Tournament Committee will provide decals during the quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals of the tournament.

Note: Decals must be affixed to both sides of the bowls by all team members

13. Practice and Warm Up

- 13.1** A team/player may warm up before any game, time allowing and with the approval of the Tournament Official. Warm up must be in the opposite direction of play and may not be deliberate play by using a jack or a mat.
- 13.2** Teams/players not playing for whatever reason, but due to play in the next round, may practice on a rink allocated by the Tournament Official.

14. Tossing for Opening Play

The skips in a team game or opponents in a Singles should toss a coin to determine who starts the game.

15. Trial Ends

- 15.1** In the Section Pairs, Mixed Pairs and Fours, 1 (one) trial end may be played at the commencement of the first game and the fourth game or when a section is moved to another green. In the playoff stages up to and including the last 16, 1 (one) trial end per game may be played. In the quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals, 1 (one) trial end in each direction may be played.
- 15.2** In the section singles, 1 (one) trial end may be played per game. In the playoff games 1 (one) trial end in each direction may be played.

16. Dead Jack/End

- 16.1** In the Pairs, Mixed Pairs and Fours games up to and including the last 16, if the jack is declared dead, it must be re-spotted on the 2m centre mark.
- 16.2** In the quarter-finals, semi-finals and finals, if the jack is declared dead the end must be declared dead.
- 16.3** In the Singles, if the Jack is declared dead the end must be declared dead.
- 16.4** All dead ends must be replayed.

17. Slow Play

- 17.1** Slow play will not be tolerated under any circumstances and players must comply with the undermentioned conditions.
- 17.2** Singles event – A player may only visit the head after their third bowl has been delivered. Should a need arise for a player to visit the head after their second bowl has been delivered, permission may be obtained from the marker. Permission may or may not be granted.
- 17.3** Pairs and Mixed Pairs events – Leads may not visit the head. The skip may visit the head after their second bowl has been delivered.
- 17.4** Fours event – Leads and seconds may not visit the head. After delivering their first bowl, thirds may be permitted to visit the head on being invited by the skip with the approval of the opposing skip. Skips may visit the head after delivery of their first bowl. To avoid delay in play both skips should go to the mat together.
- 17.5** Laws of the Sport – Clause 13 (Possession of the Rink) and Clause 12 (Position of the Players) will be strictly applied.

18. Scoring and Score Cards

- 18.1** In the Pairs, Mixed Pairs and Fours, competitors will be furnished with a scorecard which must be completed by filling in the names of all players. (Names must correlate with the Declaration Forms completed although positions may change)
- 18.2** Skips will be responsible for the scorecards and scores must be entered on the completion of each end.
- 18.3** At the completion of each round, the finishing time must be recorded, the scorecard signed by both skips and handed to the Technical Official who after comparing it with the scoreboard will sign off the scorecard and hand it to the Tournament Official.
- 18.4** In the Singles event both players and the marker must sign the scorecard and ensure the finishing time of the game is recorded before it is handed to the Technical Official who after comparing it with the scoreboard and signing off the scorecard hand it to the Tournament Official.

19. Substitutes

- 19.1** Substitutes will only be permitted in the Fours events.

20. Game Stoppage

- 20.1** The Tournament Official may, after consultation with the Tournament Committee, stop play on account of darkness, weather conditions, lightning or any other valid reason.
- 20.2** Neither the Tournament Official nor the Technical official has the authority to act with regard to the cessation of play without the sanction of the Tournament Committee.
- 20.3** In the event of inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances players shall not leave the venue until the Tournament Official has authorised them to do so.

21. Withdrawals

- 21.1** Should a team in the Pairs, Mixed Pairs and Fours or a participant in the Singles withdraw before the commencement of the Tournament, the Tournament Secretary must be advised at Headquarters immediately. See General Information.
- 21.2** In the event of a team, or participant in the Singles, withdraw from the Championship after commencement and before the completion of the league play, with or without the consent of the Controlling Body, all points scored will be expunged. In the event of a team withdrawing without the consent of Controlling Body, the club concerned may be banned from the next Tournament.

22. Determination of Game and Section Winners

- 22.1** In the Pairs, Mixed Pairs and Fours sectional play, 2 (two) points shall be awarded for a win and 1 (one) point for a game drawn.
- 22.2** In the event of a points tie on completion of the sectional play, a section winner will be decided by the following sequential criteria:
 - 22.2.1** Net Shots, Shot Aggregate, Winner of the game during sectional play.
 - 22.2.2** Should equality still exist, a deciding end will be played to determine the outright winner.
- 22.3** In the Singles sectional play 2(two) points shall be awarded for a win. In the event of a points tie, the section winner will be decided on net shots and then shot aggregate.

23. Smoking/Alcohol/Cellular Phones

Smoking (including artificial devices or e-cigarettes such as Twisp), alcohol, cellular phones and hand-held TV devices will not be permitted within 2 metres of the green while play is in progress.

24. Discipline

24.1 Non-compliance with the conditions of play may result in the disqualification of a team or participant in the Singles.

24.2 A team/player found guilty of a misdemeanour while participating in the Tournament may have any of the following penalties imposed by their home district;

24.2.1 A reprimand

24.2.2 A team/player may be denied the right to enter or participate in Gauteng Bowls and district competitions or tournaments for a period the district may deem fit.

24.3 Districts will be advised of any defaulters within 14 (fourteen) days of the conclusion of the Tournament.

25. Programme Changes

In the event of any changes in the program, appropriate announcements will be made at all participating venues.

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

1. Fours Championship

1.1 Venue Information

The section, venue, club and players are listed in the draw for the Men's and Women's Fours Championships.

1.2 Team Personnel

The personnel of any team may be altered prior to the commencement of the Tournament. No alteration or addition will be allowed after signing the declaration form and the start of the first game.

2. Substitutes

2.1.1 Should a team have no declared reserve and a substitute is necessary the Tournament Official will be guided by The Laws of the Sport of Bowls to obtain a ruling. The application of clause 33 read with clause 33.5 will be considered.

2.1.2 The appointment of a substitute shall be under the supervision of the Tournament Official and in accordance with clause 33.2,3,4 and 5 of the Laws of the Sport of Bowls, South African Edition, Third Edition.

2.2 "Dead Rubbers"

If, before the commencement of the final round, teams **definitely** cannot influence the outcome/results of their section, the skips may request the Tournament Official to abandon their last game.

2.3 Playoffs

2.3.1 Section winners will play their first playoff round at the same venue as their section league games were played.

2.3.2 Playoff games, up to and including the last 8 teams will be played over 15 ends. Semi-finals and finals will be played over 21 ends.

2.3.3 Should a playoff game be tied on completion of the prescribed number of ends, an additional end or ends will be played to determine an outright winner. Prior to the commencement of the additional end/s the skips will toss a coin to determine which team starts the end/s.

2.3.4 Dates, times and venues for further playoff games will be published on the Johannesburg Bowls Association website and posted on the noticeboard at Headquarters

3. Pairs and Mixed Pairs Championships

3.1 Venue Information

The section, venue, club and players are listed in the draws for the Men's and Women's Pairs and the Mixed Pairs Championship.

3.2 Team Personnel

The personnel of any team may be altered prior to the commencement of the Tournament. No alteration or addition will be allowed after signing the declaration form and the start of the first game.

3.3 Substitutes

There are no substitutes in the Pairs and Mixed Pairs Championships

3.4 Should there be teams that find themselves in the position that they can no longer influence the outcome/results of their section, before playing the final round of sectional play, the two skips may request the Tournament Official to abandon their last game.

3.4.1 “Dead Rubbers”

If, before the commencement of the final round, teams **definitely** cannot influence the outcome/results of their section, the skips may request the Tournament Official to abandon their last game.

3.5 Playoffs

3.5.1 Section winners will play their first playoff round at the same venue as their section league games were played.

3.5.2 Playoff games, up to and including the last 8 teams will be played over 15 ends. Semi-finals and finals will be played over 21 ends.

3.5.3 Should any of the playoff games end in a draw on completion on the prescribed ends, an additional sudden death end or ends will be played to determine an outright winner. Prior to the commencement of the sudden death end/s the two skips will toss a coin to determine which team starts the end/s.

3.5.4 Dates, times and venues for further playoff games will be published on the Gauteng Bowls website and posted on the noticeboard at Headquarters.

4. Singles Championships

4.1 Venue Information

The section, venue, club and players are listed in the draws for the Men’s and Women’s Singles Championship.

4.2 Substitutes

At the discretion of the Tournament Committee, players may be moved to different sections and substitutes may be allocated to sections where withdrawals have taken place to try and prevent any byes in the section league system.

4.3 Playoffs

4.3.1 Dates, times and venues for the playoff games will be published on the Gauteng Bowls website and posted on the noticeboard at Headquarters.
